New York Times-Historic Edition: A Westchester Library System Online Database**

The New York Times-Historic Edition database from PROQUEST provides full text new articles form 1851 to 2003. For articles published within the past 5 years, use New York Times-Current Edition.

1. You will find the New York Times-Historic Edition on the Newspaper, Magazine and Other Database page (<http://www.westchesterlibraries.org/db/>) under the subject listing NEWSPAPERS – NEW YORK.

2. Select New York Times-Historic Edition by clicking on the book icon when you are in the library or by clicking on the house icon if you are at home. The house icon will prompt you to enter your 14-digit library card number (no spaces).
3. The search screen will appear. To conduct a search for the day you were born, select *On this date* and enter your birth date (Use 4 digits for the year).
